



Oscillation-2017 Report

Description of event:

OSCILLATION '17 was an annual intercollegiate techno fun festival which was held on 25th and 26th February, 2017 in Thadomal Shahani Engineering College, Bandra by the ISF here under the guidance of Dr. Tanuja Sarode. The fest saw the presence of professionals from SKYNET SECURE SOLUTIONS. The fest consisted of 7 events in all and the footfall during our festival was around 1500 students. The events along with their details are as follows:

1) CODE WARS-

Code Wars was a Coding competition organized by IETE-TSEC. It consisted of 3 levels for the participants to compete. 32 teams had participated in this year's event. The First Round required the teams to solve the maximum number of problems in 40 minutes. 21 teams were eligible to move on to the next round.

The Second Round was the debugging round, in which the teams had to debug the codes provided to them, within a time-frame of 60 minutes. 10 teams moved on to the next round.

In the Third/Final Round, teams had to solve the given problem statements within 75 minutes.

The event was conducted on 25th February 2017.

Overall, the participants experienced 6 hours of coding excitement.

2) ETHICAL HACKING WORKSHOP-

Ethical hacking workshop was conducted by SKYNET SECURE SOLUTIONS, which included a total of around 400 students. The contents of the workshop included Social media hacking, Social engineer passwords, Hacking mails, Fake calls and Security from Trojans, etc. The workshop lasted for 6 hours in two different sessions and was held on 25th February 2017. All the participants were awarded professional course completion certificates by SKYNET SECURE SOLUTIONS.

3) CIRCUIT BUILDER-

Circuit builder was an exciting workshop on basic electronics application. The workshop including practical implementation of various IC's in day to day applications such as traffic signal, burglar alarm and Automatic street lights. The workshop was conducted on 26th of February and witnessed a participation of 60 students.



4) TECHNICAL PAPER PRESENTATION-

Speaker:


Mr. Sanket Singh, Educator at Codechef.



Blockchain:

1) Blockchain based E-Voting system

Currently, voting in India is done using an Electronic Voting Machine (EVM), which has several problems, namely time-consuming nature, needs a human resource for counting votes/managing, can be tampered with, etc.

A Blockchain-based e-voting system can not only make the whole voting procedure, secured and tamperproof but also allows voters to vote from their smart devices, thus reducing the time consumed.

Counting votes would also be easier and will be subject to fewer inaccuracies and more transparency.

2) Blockchain in Healthcare

Healthcare is an industry where the ability to access information or any omission in a patient's record could be the difference between life and death.

Maintaining patients' previous records is an integral part of the Healthcare Industry. The current scenario puts the onus on the patients to retain physical copies of their medical history which pose inherent challenges like portability and accessibility.

A blockchain-based solution is required that allows patients to add their medical records to the blockchain securely.

This information should be encrypted and only accessible by authorized personnel, which is allowed by the patient.

Such a tamper-proof and secured system would easily bypass the drawbacks of the current paradigm, without sacrificing functionality.

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TSEC Hacks 2021 Report

TSEC CodeCell, under the able guidance of Prof.Tasneem Mirza, hosted its annual flagship event **TSEC Hacks**, a **40 hour Online Hackathon**, that was conducted from the 26th of March to the 28th of March, 2021. The aim of this competition was to nurture innovation, motivate the participants to code, and foster healthy competition among the participants. The event had participants from different colleges, different streams and different undergraduate levels.

The 40 hour Hackathon was conducted as follows:

- <u>Day 1 (26th March)</u> The Opening Ceremony began at 5 pm followed by the Problem Statement Explanation. The Coding Period for the participants began at 7 pm.
- <u>Day 2 (27th March)</u> The Mentoring Sessions commenced at 10 am and went on till 8:30 pm where the students received guidance from the mentors as to how to improve upon their projects.
- <u>Day 3 (28th March)</u> The Coding Round ended at 11 am, subsequently followed by the Phase 1 of judging. Phase 2 of Judging commenced at 3 pm, and after deliberation by the judges, the winners were announced at the Closing Ceremony.

The Hackathon being an online event was conducted on numerous platforms, particularly WhatsApp, Zoom and Discord. The teams consisted of 2-4 members, with each team having to pay a registration fee of ₹100 after getting shortlisted.
