NSS-TSEC has been conducting **Cardiac Arrest Resuscitation Workshop** in collaboration with Holy Family Hospital, Bandra from the past three years. Due to COVID19 Lockdown, the session was conducted on an online platform.

Om 29th August 2020 & 24th February 2021, **NSS-TSEC** in collaboration with **Holy Family Hospital, Bandra** organized an online workshop on Cardiac Arrest Resuscitation under the **iCARE** initiative with the strong support of the Principal, the Program Officers, and Students. The webinar was conducted on Google Meet Application.

The speaker for the session were Ms. Sumaiya Raghavan, Operations Head at iCARE and Mr. Anand Shrivastav, Project Director at iCARE. Both the speakers were qualified trainers in first aid heart saving and CPR and have received certification from the American Heart Association. iCARE is a non-profit initiative by the Holy Family Hospital, Bandra that dedicates to the cause of educating people on how to save the life of a Sudden Cardiac Arrest victim until the medical emergency arrives. Under this initiative, they provide trainings free of cost with the motive to spread awareness among people and save lives. The online workshop conducted was the first session out of the three-session training program under the iCARE initiative which ultimately leads to earning the Heart Marshall Badge.

In this workshop, the speakers gave an insight into the importance and need to undergo this training by presenting facts and real-life examples. They explained the difference between a heart attack and a cardiac arrest which is considered similar by many. The participants were enlightened about the Good Samaritan Law [2016], which offers legal protection to people who give reasonable assistance to those who are, or whom they believe to be, injured, ill, in peril, or otherwise incapacitated. The speaker encouraged the participants to help strangers in case of an emergency, citing the above law. The main objective of the workshop was to give an idea to participants on how they could save the lives of people during a cardiac arrest. The four steps [Recognize, Call, CPR, AED] to save a person during sudden cardiac arrest were innovatively explained to the participants through a PowerPoint presentation, animated videos and a dummy mannequin used by the speaker. The training was concluded by giving an overview of how to use an Automated External Defibrillator [AED] machine, which is required to give electric shocks in addition to the CPR technique.

The webinar was very informative and interactive. Every query/doubt was enthusiastically answered by the speakers during the Q&A session. The speakers even encouraged to conduct more such sessions for a larger number of students and teachers to make them aware of the cardiac arrest and CPR techniques to save lives during an emergency.

On the 6th April 2021, NSS-TSEC organized a webinar in collaboration with Sanjeevani Life Beyond Cancer (SLBC) titled "Cancer prevention and healthy lifestyle" with strong support of the Principal, the Program Officers and Students. The webinar was conducted on Zoom Meeting Application, duration for which was 2 hours. A total of 75 volunteers, including 31 female and 44 male volunteers participated in this event.

The speaker for the session was **Mrs. Sumki Begum** from **SLBC**, **India**. She is working as a Program Outreach Coordinator at SLBC. The purpose of the organization is to increase awareness about Cancer as a disease and about preventing cancer through healthy living.

The session started with statistical data being presented about cancer and how common it has become in the carcinogenic environment that we are living in. Data like the projected number of patients with cancer in India, the common 5 leading sites of breast, lung, mouth, cervix uteri, and tongue, trends of increase in cancer incidence rate in both sexes, etc. were presented. Information regarding the probability of early diagnosis and its benefits in various cancers like breast (57.0%), cervix uteri (60.0%), head and neck (66.6%), and stomach (50.8%) cancer, were shared. Thus the session promoted vigilance towards one's health by promoting regular testing.

The session also helped the participants identify faults in their lifestyle and recognize the impact of the said bad lifestyle habits. Through a talk and graphical representation via ppt solutions were also offered and information was given about the right lifestyle habits and the benefits of inculcating the same.
