MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) is made

Between

Rashtriya Chemicals and Fertilizers Ltd., a Govt of India Undertaking and incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956, having its Registered Office at Priyadarshini Building, Eastern Express Highway, Sion, Mumbai -400 022, (hereinafter referred to as "RCF", which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning hereof, be deemed to include its successors and permitted assigns) of the ONE PART.

AND

Thadomal Shahani Engineering College having the affiliation with Mumbai University registered under AICTE and having its registered office at P.G. Kher Marg, Off Linking Road, TPS III, Bandra(W), Mumbai, Maharashtra 400050 represented by Dr. G. T. Thampi, Principal, Thadomal Shahani Engineering College its authorized signatory (hereinafter referred to as the TSEC which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning hereof, be deemed to include its executors, trustees and permitted assigns) of the OTHER PART.

WHEREAS:

"RCF" is engaged in the business of manufacturing and marketing of Fertilizer and Industrial products throughout the country, through its Retail Outlet dealer network.

"TSEC" approached "RCF" and expressed its intent to work together to impart employment-oriented skills training for students of the "TSEC".

RCF expressed its intent to provide hands on practical training to its students with the guidance and assistance of experts from **RCF** and TSEC in the mutual benefit of both the organizations as well as students.

"RCF" considering the intent of "TSEC" and in fulfilment of the social need to train the students with practical experience has agreed to work jointly to enhance the skill of the students of "TSEC".

This MOU between **RCF** and TSEC is with specific purpose of industrial operation and maintenance exposure with the students to help them acquainted with the needs of the industry and help them in employability.

NOW THIS MOU WITNESSETH AS UNDER:

The MOU between **RCF** and **TSEC** witnessed as per terms and conditions set forth hereunder:

- 1. Training/Internship for various courses for students in different educational streams. It is explicitly understood that the MoU is limited only for the students of TSEC at RCF premises.
- 2. This MoU will be valid for a period of one year from the date of signing of the MoU and shall be renewed on any such terms as may be mutually agreed between the parties.
- **3.** Student's profile and Batch Size: All students attending the training programme have to have the following criteria:
 - · College identity card
 - · Aadhar Card.
 - Number of students per batch shall be about 20 to 30. Minimum two teaching staff members of **TSEC** shall accompany the students during the training programme.
- 4. The scope of RCF is as mentioned below:

Students may be exposed to the practical industrial training for following points as per training requirement:

- 4.1 Advanced Process operation in Chemical Industry
- 4.2 Advanced Automation System, digital communication protocols and wireless devices
- 4.3 Advanced Electrical Systems and Best Maintenance practices in industry
- 4.4 Advanced Mechanical Equipments and Best Maintenance practices in industry
- 4.5 Any other customized content programme in the scope of RCF
- 5. TSEC and RCF covenant with each other that there shall be no hands on training in running plants and no disturbance to be caused to running plants by the students.

6. Safety and Security norms:

The students shall be required to observe safety precautions and rules of the company. The students will have to strictly follow the instructions of the official of the company. They should not visit the plant without instructions and permission. For any incident/accident, the students of **TSEC** shall be solely responsible and RCF will not be liable for the same, or for any injury suffered.









7. RCF covenants that accommodation shall be provided subject to availability by RCF - Chembur in their hostel at the prevailing rates and the same to be recovered from TSEC by RCF - Chembur. TSEC shall be responsible for the payments to be made by the students for the hostel facilities availed by them. RCF shall not be responsible for the safety of student and it shall be the sole responsibility of the students.

8. Commercial terms and conditions:

- i. TSEC shall intimate RCF Chembur the names of the Students for training and the mutually decide the date of training programme through Email to RCF – Chembur office prior one week.
- ii. RCF Chembur will submit the certificate to students of **TSEC** on completion of training.
- iii. RCF Chembur will not collect any training fees from the students in any manner whatsoever in connection of this Training Agreement. All such fees/charges shall be collected in advance from **TSEC** only.
- iv. TSEC shall pay training charges to RCF Chembur as below
 - a. The training charges for students will be τ 2500/- per participant per day (Non-residential) plus GST as applicable.

The rates offered above shall be valid for a period of one year.

v. Training charges includes training programme kit, mid-morning breakfast, lunch and tea during training sessions. Dinner and other food charges will be paid by students to catering service provider at actuals.

9. Termination

Either party reserves the right to terminate this MOU with a written notice of not less than 30 days.

10. Jurisdiction:

The MOU shall be governed by and constructed according to the laws in force in India. The parties hereby submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts situated at Mumbai for all purposes.

11. Amendments

Either party may, with the prior intimation to the other, and with the prior written consent of the other party may amend, reduce, limit and/or expand the scope of the work based on the mutually agreed terms & conditions, with a prior written notice of not less than 30 days.

12. Arbitration

13. In case of Govt. Organization:

"In the event of any dispute or difference relating to the interpretation and application of the provisions of commercial contract(s) between Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs)/ Port Trusts inter se and also between CPSEs and Government Departments/ Organizations (excluding disputes concerning Railways, Income Tax, Customs & Excise Departments), such dispute or difference shall be taken up by either party for resolution through AMRCD as mentioned in DPE OM No. 4(1)/2013-DPE(GM)/FTS-1835 dated 22-05-2018".

14. In case of Private Organization:

All disputes or differences, whatsoever, arising between the parties out of or relating to the construction meaning and operation or effect of this contract or breach thereof which remains unresolved for a period of more than 30 days from the date of written request from one of the party, the matter shall be referred to the sole arbitrator agreed upon between the parties or failing upon such agreement, to be nominated under the provision of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 as amended from time to time.

The decision or award so given by the sole Arbitrator shall be final and binding on the parties. The Venue of the arbitration shall be at Mumbai. The language of the arbitration shall be in English

15. Force Majeure

Neither party will be liable to the other for non-performance of this Memorandum or any part thereof due to Force Majeure conditions. Force Majeure includes (but is not limited to) Acts of Gods, breakdown of Communication system, Equipment, labor disputes, Fire, Floods, explosions, Acts of sabotage or terrorism, War, Riots & any other circumstances, (natural and/or otherwise) beyond the control of the party.

16. Relations between the Parties:

Subject to the terms and conditions of this MOU, the Party of the other part shall act as an independent entity and nothing in the MOU shall create or be deemed to create a partnership or relationship of principal/agent, employer/employee or joint-venture between the Parties and the relationship between **RCF** and **TSEC** is that of Principal to Principal basis. The Party of the other part is not authorized to assume or create any obligation or responsibility, including, but not limited to, obligations based on warranties or guarantees or other contractual obligations, on behalf or in the name of the RCF.









17. CONFIDENTIALITY

The Parties, to the extent of their respective rights to do so, shall exchange such information and data as is reasonably required by each Party to perform its obligations and responsibilities under this Agreement. Each Party agrees to keep in confidence and to use the same degree of care as would do with respect to its own proprietary data to prevent disclosure to third parties of all technical information, data and confidential business information

18. Notices

Any notice to be given under this MOU shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly and properly served upon the parties hereto if delivered against acknowledgement of by Registered mail with acknowledgement due, addressed to the parties herein at the following addresses or changed addresses, duly notified by the Parties. Any notice transmitted by fax or other form of recorded communication shall be deemed given and received on the first business day after its transmission.

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding is made and entered in Mumbai on Z day of July 2022 between

Six Ladder Solutions Private Limited (SLSPL) a Company registered under Companies Act 2013 & having Registered Office at 704, Shankar Dhara, V P Road (B Singh Path), Vile Parle West, Mumbai 400056 (with expression shall mean and include administrators, executors, service providers and assignors) & (hereinafter referred to as **SLSPL**) party of the **First Part**

Ms/Mr. Ds. G. T. Themm having registered office at Theolomal Shahani Engs. College Active Navigna Sahani Road, Bomdag (w) Milmbai - Ucroso (with expression shall mean and include customer, administrators, executors, school, university and assignors) & (hereinafter referred to as college) party of the Second Part)

- Whereas SLSPL will provide a platform & job board for colleges, students & Employers wherein employers verified by the college will be able to post jobs for the students of colleges & universities.
- 2. Employers can interact with students and hire them if suitable.
- Dashboard with live data for Colleges, Employers and Students
- SLSPL will assist and help Colleges to host career fairs, events, and interview days through the platform in consultations with college authorities, Employers and others.
- The party of the first part will enter into a formal contract on mutual acceptance of Terms & Conditions discussed and notified & same shall be binding on both the parties.
- Any other service as required either by the college, student and employer related to providing employment opportunities and related service; these services may include soft skills training, partnerships with employers, or any ancillary services related to employment.

The terms & conditions of service are as follows:

- 1. Facilities and Data Transfer
 - 1.1. All facilities used to store and process Data will adhere to reasonable security standards no less protective than the security standards at facilities where **SLSPL** stores and processes its own information of a similar type. The said data will be governed by the present and future applicable laws and regulations in-force within the jurisdiction of the parties
- 2. Modifications to the Services
 - 2.1. **SLSPL** may make commercially reasonable changes to the User Interface / User eXperience, features, and any other components of the product from time to time. If **SLSPL** makes a material change to the Services, **SLSPL** will inform the **College**.
- 3. End User Consent



- 3.1. **Colleges**, Employers, Administrators may have the access, monitor, use, or disclose data available to End Users within the End User Accounts. **College** will ensure all required consents from End Users to allow:
 - 3.1.1. College's access, monitoring, use and disclosure of this data and SLSPL providing College with the ability to do so and
 - 3.1.2. SLSPL to provide the Services.

4. Unauthorized Use

- 4.1. **College** will make commercially reasonable efforts to prevent unauthorized use of the Services and to terminate any unauthorized use. **College** will promptly notify **SLSPL** of any unauthorized use of, or access to, the Services of which it becomes aware.
- 4.2. Except to the extent expressly permitted in this Agreement or required by law on a non-excludable basis, the licence granted by the Provider to the **College** is subject to the following prohibitions:
 - 4.2.1. the **College** must not sub-license its right to access and use the Hosted Services
 - 4.2.2. the **College** must not permit any unauthorised person or application to access or use the Hosted Services
 - 4.2.3. the College must not use the Hosted Services to provide services to third parties
 - 4.2.4. the **College** must not republish or redistribute any content or material from the Hosted Services
 - 4.2.5. the **College** must not make any alteration to the Platform, except as permitted by the Documentation and
 - 4.2.6. the **College** must not conduct or request that any other person conduct any load testing or penetration testing on the Platform or Hosted Services without the prior written consent of the Provider.

5. Availability and Uptime

5.1. The Provider shall use all reasonable endeavours to maintain the availability of the Hosted Services to the **College** at the gateway between the public internet and the network of the hosting services provider for the Hosted Services, but does not guarantee 100% availability.

6. Technical Support Services

6.1. Technical support will be provided by **SLSPL** as and when necessary to extent expressly covered in this Agreement

7. Termination for Breach

- 7.1. Either party may suspend performance or terminate this Agreement if:
 - 7.1.1. the other party is in material breach of the Agreement and fails to cure that breach within 30 (thirty days) after receipt of written notice;
 - 7.1.2. the other party ceases its business operations or becomes subject to insolvency proceedings and the proceedings are not dismissed within 90 (ninety days); or
 - 7.1.3. the other party is in material breach of this Agreement more than two times notwithstanding any cure of such breaches.
- 7.2. **College** may terminate this Agreement for any reason (or no reason) with 60 (sixty days) prior written notice to **SLSPL**, provided, however, that **College** will

remain obligated to pay any Fees for Services which **College** has purchased applicable to the remainder of the then current Services Term for those Services.

8. Exceptions of Termination

- 8.1. For the avoidance of doubt, downtime caused directly or indirectly by any of the following shall not be considered a breach of this Agreement:
 - 8.1.1. a Force Majeure Event;
 - 8.1.2. a fault or failure of the internet or any public telecommunications network;
 - 8.1.3. a fault or failure of the College's computer systems or networks;
 - 8.1.4. any breach by the College of this Agreement; or
 - 8.1.5. scheduled maintenance carried out in accordance with this Agreement.

9. Warranties

- 9.1. The SLSPL warrants to the College that:
 - 9.1.1. the Provider has the legal right and authority to enter into this Agreement and to perform its obligations under this Agreement
 - 9.1.2. the Provider will comply with all applicable legal and regulatory requirements applying to the exercise of the Provider's rights and the fulfilment of the Provider's obligations under this Agreement and
 - 9.1.3. the Provider has or has access to all necessary know-how, expertise and experience to perform its obligations under this Agreement.
- 9.2. The College warrants to SLSPL that:
 - 9.2.1. the Platform and Hosted Services will conform in all material respects with the Hosted Services Specification
 - 9.2.2. the Hosted Services will be free from Hosted Services Defects
 - 9.2.3. the Platform will be free from viruses, worms, Trojan horses, ransomware, spyware, adware and other malicious software programs and
 - 9.2.4. the Platform will incorporate security features reflecting the requirements of good industry practice.

10. Force Majeure

10.1. Either Party shall be excused from any delay or failure in performance required hereunder if caused by reason of any occurrence or contingency beyond its reasonable control, including, but not limited to, acts of God, acts of war, fire, insurrection, strikes, lock-outs or other serious labour disputes, riots, earthquakes, floods, explosions or other acts of nature. The obligations and rights of the Party so excused shall be extended on a day-to-day basis for the time period equal to the period of such excusable interruption. When such events have abated, the Parties' respective obligations hereunder shall resume. In the event the interruption of the excused Party's obligations continues for a period in excess of ninety (90) calendar days, either Party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) calendar days' prior written notice to the other Party.

11. No Agency

11.1. The parties are independent contractors, and this Agreement does not create an agency, partnership or joint venture.

12. Amendments

12.1. Any amendment must be in writing and expressly state that it is amending this Agreement.

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13. SISPL's confidentiality obligations

- 13.1. The provider must
 - 13.1.1. keep the College Confidential Information strictly confidential;
 - 13.1.2. not disclose the College Confidential Information to any person without the College's prior written consent and then only under conditions of confidentiality approved in writing by the College OR no less onerous than those contained in this Agreement
 - 13.1.3. use the same degree of care to protect the confidentiality of the College Confidential Information as the Provider uses to protect the Provider's own confidential information of a similar nature, being at least a reasonable degree of care;
 - 13.1.4. act in good faith at all times in relation to the College Confidential Information and
 - 13.1.5. not use any of the College Confidential Information for any purpose other than the specific purpose.
 - 13.1.6. Not sell or disclose the college's data to any third party
- 13.2. the Provider may disclose the **College** Confidential Information to the Provider's officers, employees, professional advisers, insurers, agents and subcontractors who have a need to access the **College** Confidential Information for the performance of their work with respect to this Agreement and who are bound by a written agreement or professional obligation to protect the confidentiality of the **College** Confidential Information.
- 13.3. This Clause 13 imposes no obligations upon the Provider with respect to **College** Confidential Information that:
 - 13.3.1. is known to the Provider before disclosure under this Agreement and is not subject to any other obligation of confidentiality;
 - 13.3.2. is or becomes publicly known through no act or default of the Provider; or
 - 13.3.3. is obtained by the Provider from a third party in circumstances where the Provider has no reason to believe that there has been a breach of an obligation of confidentiality.
- 13.4. The restrictions in this Clause 13 do not apply to the extent that any **College** Confidential Information is required to be disclosed by any law or regulation, by any judicial or governmental order or request, or pursuant to disclosure requirements relating to the listing of the stock of the Provider on any recognised stock exchange.
- 13.5. The provisions of this Clause 13 shall continue in force indefinitely following the termination of this Agreement OR for a period of six months following the termination of this Agreement, at the end of which period they will cease to have effect.



14. Exclusivity – **SLSPL** will exclusively provide and maintain a branded job board for the **college** and its end users for minimum period of two years. The **college** gives us explicit rights to use the **college**/school/university's brand for the said purpose of creating a job board for its students and in good faith.

15. Scheduled maintenance

- 15.1. The Provider may from time to time suspend the Hosted Services for the purposes of scheduled maintenance to the Platform, providing that such scheduled maintenance must be carried out in accordance with this Clause 15
- 15.2. The Provider shall ensure that all scheduled maintenance is carried out outside Business Hours.

16. College Data

- 16.1. The **College** hereby grants to the Provider a non-exclusive license to copy, reproduce, store, distribute, publish, export, adapt, edit and translate the **College** Data to the extent reasonably required for the performance of the Provider's obligations and the exercise of the Provider's rights under this Agreement. The **College** also grants to the Provider the right to sub-license these rights to its hosting, connectivity and telecommunications service providers, subject to any express restrictions elsewhere in this Agreement.
- 16.2. The **College** warrants to the Provider that the **College** Data OR the **College** Data when used by the Provider in accordance with this Agreement will not infringe the Intellectual Property Rights or other legal rights of any person and will not breach the provisions of any law, statute or regulation, in any jurisdiction and under any applicable law.
- 16.3. The Provider can delete **college** data when the service is completed, contract is terminated, or in any other situation deemed reasonable by the provider

17. No assignment of Intellectual Property Rights

17.1. Nothing in this Agreement shall operate to assign or transfer any Intellectual Property Rights from the Provider to the College, or from the College to the Provider.

18. Data protection

18.1. The Provider OR Each party shall comply with the Data Protection Laws with respect to the processing of the College Personal Data.

- 18.2. The **College** warrants to the Provider that it has the legal right to disclose all Personal Data that it does in fact disclose to the Provider under or in connection with this Agreement.
- 18.3. The **College** shall only supply to the Provider, and the Provider shall only process, in each case under or in relation to this Agreement
- 18.4. The **College** hereby authorises the Provider to make the following transfers of **College** Personal Data:
 - 18.4.1. the Provider may transfer the **College** Personal Data internally to its own employees, offices and facilities in *jurisdiction(s)*, providing that such transfers must be protected by appropriate safeguard.
 - 18.4.2. the Provider may transfer the **College** Personal Data to its third party processors in the jurisdictions identified in this agreement such as internet service providers, hosting servers, telecommunications towers, etc (Data processing information) and may permit its third party processors to make such transfers, providing that such transfers must be protected by any appropriate safeguards identified therein; and
- 18.5. The Provider shall ensure that persons authorised to process the **College** Personal Data have committed themselves to confidentiality or are under an appropriate statutory obligation of confidentiality.
- 18.6. The Provider shall, insofar as possible and taking into account the nature of the processing, take appropriate technical and organisational measures to assist the **College** with the fulfilment of the **College**'s obligation to respond to requests exercising a data subject's rights under the Data Protection Laws.
- 18.7. The Provider shall assist the **College** in ensuring compliance with the obligations relating to the security of processing of personal data, the notification of personal data breaches to the supervisory authority, the communication of personal data breaches to the data subject, data protection impact assessments and prior consultation in relation to high-risk processing under the Data Protection Laws.

19. Indemnification

19.1. Both Parties shall indemnify and hold harmless the other from and against all direct losses, costs, actions, suits, damages, liabilities, fines, penalties of any kind or nature, third party claims whatsoever resulting from or relating to the misrepresentation, breach of any of the terms of this agreement, negligence, default, unauthorized act or omission/commission on the part of such Party

20. Jurisdiction

20.1. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India. The adjudication of any dispute will be the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of Mumbai





21. Miscellaneous

- 21.1. SLSPL does not guarantee or make an offer of any employment
- 21.2. **SLSPL** provides the platform for networking purposes
- 21.3. **Employers** can accept invites of **colleges** who have profiles on the platform
- 21.4. **Colleges** can accept invites of **Employers** who have profiles on the platform

22. Termination

- 22.1. Either party can terminate this agreement at any time they find fit
- 22.2. Each party needs to communicate the other at least 15 (Fifteen) days notice before termination

23. Commercial Considerations

- 23.1. The College will not bear any costs for using and operating their student job board and Placement Management System
- 23.2. Any add on services utilized by the college (soft skills training, upskilling, or any other such services) can be chargeable subject to a separate commercial agreement between the two parties.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

<u>Thadomal Shahani Engineering college</u> with its campus at <u>Mumbai Maharashtra</u> here in after referred to as "<u>College</u>", which expression shall, unless repugnant to the meaning or context thereof, be deemed to include its legal representatives and permitted assigns) of the SECOND PART;

The Company and the College shall thereafter, as the context may require, individually be referred to as a "Party" and collectively be referred to as the "Parties".

THE PARTIES TO THIS MOU HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. SCOPE

- 1.1. The College is an educational institution recognized under law, providing education to students for various disciplines.
- 1.2. The Company owns and operates a technology platform which provides among other services, test preparation and online learning called <u>www.unacademy.com</u> or the Unacademy App ("Platform").
- 1.3. The College in desirous of engaging with the Company for various collaborative activities ("Activities and/or Activity") as given in this MOU; The Company may
 - 1.3.1. conduct Webinars to create awareness about career opportunities in the subject or field that the students at the College are interested in;
 - 1.3.2. conduct technical workshops, advance technologies workshops and campus placement workshops.
- 1.4. The details of the Activities shall be mutually decided between the Parties and confirmed via email("Email") or by a separate agreement or contract as required.
- 1.5. The College shall provide the contact details of the students, with the required consents, who need to be enrolled in the webinars and workshops to the Company, or who are meritorious.

- 1.6. The Parties agree, in the event the Parties decide to confirm details of the Activities via Email, such Email shall be a valid and binding on both Parties, along with corresponding terms and condition for each Activity.
- 1.7. The Parties agree that this MOU is being entered purely for collaborative purposes without any expectation of any monetary compensation.
- 1.8. In the event the College recognizes any students who are meritorious, upon mutual agreement between the Parties, the Company shall offer special discounts for those individuals. It is hereby clarified that the discounts can be availed directly by those students who purchase a subscription on the Platform and the Company shall not collect or process any payments to the College at any point of time. The discounted subscriptions will be provided by the Company subject to the College sharing the requested details of the individuals with the Company. The Company may even share a unique code that the student may have to input at the time of availing the subscription in order to avail the special discounts. The details and terms and conditions for any Activity involving such discounted subscription shall be shared via Email or a separate agreement or contract.

2. TERM

This MOU shall commence on the Effective Date and shall continue until DD/MM/YYY ("Term")

3. TERMINATION

- 3.1 Either Party shall have the right to terminate this MOU by providing 30 (Thirty) days written notice in the event that any Party materially breaches its obligations under this MOU:
 - a. in a manner that is irremediable; or
 - b. fails to remedy a remediable breach within 30 days after being put on notice of such breach by the non-breaching Party; or
 - undergoes a "bankruptcy event", as such term is conventionally understood or for convenience.
- 3.2 Upon termination of this MOU and thereafter, neither Party shall provide to any beneficiary or third party or the public at large, the impression that the association between the Parties is continuing or allow such impression to be created.
- 3.3 Notwithstanding the termination of this MOU, the terms contained in Clause 4 below, in relation to confidentiality and non-disclosure, shall survive for a period of 2 (Two) years from the date of termination of this MOU.

4. CONFIDENTIALITY AND NON-DISCLOSURE

4.1 Each Party hereby acknowledges that, based on the Party's past or current relationship with the other Party such Party has had access to, or may have access to and become acquainted with the Confidential Information (as defined below) of the other Party. Each Party hereby covenants and agrees that it shall not, in any fashion, form or manner, unless previously and specifically consented to in writing by the other Party, either directly or indirectly use, divulge, transmit or otherwise disclose or cause to be used, divulged, transmitted or otherwise disclosed to any person, firm, partnership, corporation or other entity now existing or hereafter created, in any manner whatsoever (other than to its directors, officers, employees and advisors and other than as required by law), any of the disclosing Party's Confidential Information of any kind, nature or description. Each Party hereby further acknowledges and agrees that the sale or unauthorized use, transmission or other disclosure of any of the disclosing Party's Confidential Information which is in their possession constitutes unfair competition and the receiving Party covenants and agrees that it shall not engage in any unfair competition with the disclosing Party. The foregoing provisions shall not be construed to prevent the receiving Party from making use of or

disclosing information that is in the public domain through no fault of receiving Party; provided, however, specific information shall not be deemed to be in the public domain merely because it is encompassed by some general information that is published or in the public domain. The foregoing provisions shall also not be construed as preventing Company from reasonable and bona fide efforts to promote the Company using Personality's Services.

4.2 "Confidential Information" shall mean (a) this MOU and any information which is disclosed by any Party to the other Party pursuant to, or in connection with this MOU (whether orally or in writing and whether or not such information is expressly stated to be confidential); (b) any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with this MOU or the resolution of such claim or dispute; (c) any information or materials prepared by or for the Parties or its representatives that contain or otherwise reflect, or are generated from the Confidential Information; (d) in case of the Company, any trade secrets, information, ideas, concepts, processes, techniques, or any other Intellectual Property, any information or data relating to the affairs of any Party including any project, work in progress, reports, statistics, summaries, records, future business, revenue projections, operational or financial plans, financing or personnel matters, information relating to present or future works, views, subscribers, clients, customers, employees, key persons engaged by the Company. Confidential Information shall not include any information in the public domain, provided, however, specific information shall not be deemed to be in the public domain merely because it is encompassed by some general information that is published or in the public domain.

5. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

5.1 Each Party hereby represents and warrants to the other Party that it has the legal capability to grant the rights under this MOU and to satisfy its obligations and responsibilities hereunder.

5.2 Other than as specifically provided herein, each Party warrants that it shall not represent to any third party that it is acting on behalf of the other Party and in no case shall each Party create or allow the creation of the impression that the other Party has any direct or indirect relationship with or liability to the beneficiaries or such other third party.

5.3 Each Party ('Indemnifying Party') agrees that it shall, at its own expense, indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other Party and the other Party's officers, directors, employees, representatives, agents, respective directors, trustees and assigns from and against any and all direct liability (including but not limited to liabilities, judgments, damages, losses, claims, costs and expenses, including attorneys' fees and expenses) and any other direct loss that may occur, or arise from or relate to malfeasance, misfeasance or deliberate negligence or breach of any representations or warranties by the Indemnifying Party, in the performance of the Indemnifying Party's material obligations under this MOU.

5.4 To the extent permitted by applicable law, in no event shall either Party be liable for any special, indirect, consequential, exemplary or incidental damages, however caused to the other Party, arising out of or relating to this MoU.

6. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

6.1 Each Party acknowledges the intellectual property rights of any kind, including but not limited to copyright, patent rights, design rights, service marks, trademarks, logos, titles, slogans, property rights and any other rights, held by the other Party. The Parties undertake that neither of them shall claim any right, title and interest in the intellectual property rights of the other Party.

6.2 During the Term, each Party grants the other Party a limited, non-exclusive, royalty-free right under this MOU to use its name and logo for the purposes of public relations and promoting the association between the Parties under this MOU, including without limitation, promoting over social media platforms, promotional material as approved by the other Party in writing and all related collateral.



Each Party shall obtain the other Party's approval before using the other Party's name and logo in public relations, promotional and related communications as provided herein, it being agreed by the other Party that such approval shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. Further, it is clarified and agreed among the Parties that any such approval granted shall sustain during the Term for repeated use of such approving Party's name and logo in similar public relations, promotional and related communications for purposes of the Programme defined herein.

6.3 The Parties agree that subject to the licenses granted hereinabove, any intellectual property rights created by either Party in the course of giving effect to this MOU shall be owned by the Party that

creates the same.

7. GOVERNING LAW, DISPUTE RESOLUTION AND JURISDICTION

This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of India. Any dispute under this MOU shall be resolved by arbitration by a sole arbitrator appointed in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, in Bengaluru, India. The courts of Bengaluru, India shall have jurisdiction over this MOU.

8. MISCELLANEOUS

This MOU constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the Agreement and supersedes all prior written agreements and understandings, both written and oral, between the Parties with respect to the Agreement. This MOU shall be binding in all respects and shall govern the relationship between the Parties. This MOU shall be binding upon executors, successors in interest and permitted assigns of the respective Parties. Any provision of the MOU may be amended or waived if, and only if such amendment or waiver is in writing and signed, in the case of an amendment by each Party, or in the case of a waiver, by the Party against whom the waiver is to be effective. Either Party may not, assign, in whole or in part, the benefits or obligations of the MOU to any other person without the prior written consent of the other Party. The MOU may be executed in counterparts, each of which when executed shall constitute an original, but both of which when taken together shall constitute one and the same agreement. Nothing contained in this MOU shall be construed as creating any agency, legal representative, partnership, association of persons or other form of joint enterprise between the Parties. Neither Party shall have authority to contract for or bind the other in any manner whatsoever.

At least one hundred twenty (120) days before the expiration of the initial term and any subsequent renewal terms, Thadomal Shahani Engineering College shall review this MOU and iSC may renew this MOU on approval of Thadomal Shahani Engineering College .
- 3. Right of Revocation: Either party may terminate this MOU on 120 days' written notice to the other party. Termination may occur upon the breach of this MOU by one of the parties. 
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
