Heart Marshal Training with iCARE, Holy Family hospital is conducted for students for educating them on how to save the life of a Sudden Cardiac Arrest victim until the medical help arrives. Students visit orphanages and old age homes at regular intervals where they spend time and conduct activities. Additionally, lectures by experts in the field of environment, health and education are also featured throughout the academic year. TSEC's students and teachers are heavily invested in social interventions in selected, remote Adivasi villages of Neral at the foothills of Matheran. This is regarding the activities to be performed by higher educational institutions under the Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat Campaign.

- So far, pairings have been done for all HE institutions across the paired states – for example, IIT of state 1 has been paired with IIT of paired state and similarly for NITs/IITs/ CU/ IISers/ IIMs/ RUSA institutions / AICTE institutions
- The paired institutions were asked to carry out the following activities :
 - **Student Exchange** involving 5 day mutual exchange visit of 50 students between paired institutions
 - **Teacher Exchange** involving visit of 50 teachers from every state to the paired state
 - **Youth Festival** in one selected institution in every state with participation of students from various institutions in the paired state
 - **EBSB Day**
 - **EBSB Club**
 - **Translation of Books** of Paired States
- Based on feedback from institutions, it is understood that several of them are finding it difficult to organize the Student Exchange activity owing to time, budget and other logistic constraints.
- The Action Plan has therefore been reconsidered and redrawn with focus on low cost, high volume activities which can be easily woven into the curriculum of the institution . The proposed Action Plan is as follows :

I. ACTIVITIES AT THE INSTITUTION LEVEL

1. **EBSB Day** – one day in every month will be observed as EBSB Day in every HE institution where activities like cultural demonstrations -songs, dance, drama of paired state, film shows of paired states, food festivals, reading of translated books of paired states can be undertaken. The list is indicative, there can be other similar activities.
2. **EBSB Clubs** – Every HEI will have an EBSB club. Objective is to propagate the culture, language, art forms etc of the paired state by organizing appropriate activities. These can include reading of books from paired states, cultural programmes, cuisine, listening to news from the paired state, listening to/ watching a language Radio/ TV News / other programme from the paired state, holding quiz about the paired state etc. In addition to the above the EBSB Clubs can lead/ drive other EBSB activities being organized by the institution.
The Best EBSB club to be awarded by Hon'ble Minister on 31st Oct 2020
3. **Celebrating Statehood Day** of the paired state
4. **Notice/ Display Boards about paired state** - Each institution can have one or two notice / display boards where students will put up information/ pictures/ write-ups etc about the paired state. This activity can be lead by the EBSB Club.

5. **Optional classes to teach language** of the paired state. Alternatively, students can be encouraged to learn the language of paired state through many available online apps. Each student must learn at least **the alphabets, 100 sentences, 5 songs, 20 proverbs in the language** of the paired state,
6. **Essay Writing/ Debates/ Drama / Quiz / Cultural Programme** based on some aspect of the paired state, preferably in the language of the paired state. This can be linked to the area of study of the students. For eg students of Economics can be asked to write an essay on an economic problem of the paired state, Political Science students can debate on some political issue on the paired state, Engineering students can look for technical applications suited to the paired state.
7. **Pledge on Swachhta/Single use plastic/water saving/ National Unity** in the language of partnering states/UTs.
8. **Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat Utsav.**
9. Bringing out **Bi-Annual Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat Newsletter** / Report

II. ACTIVITIES BETWEEN PAIRED INSTITUTIONS

1. **Skype / Email Friends** – Students should make skype / email friends from among students of the paired institutions and interact with them on a regular basis like penfriends
2. **Video Conferencing / Skype sessions** between groups of students of the paired institutions. These sessions will help the students get to know each other and learn about each other's states. Subjects for these interactions in can be related to the study area of the interacting groups to make it more meaningful. There can be literary discussions, debates on socio-economic issues, discussions on political , technical, engineering, environment and other such issues, or even song and dance recitals, poetry sessions as part of these interactions.
3. **Hackathon between paired states** – AICTE will organize the hackathons. All HE institutions in a state can participate. Institutions will be asked to identify both technical and socio-economic problems in their states. Two problems from each state (one technical, one socio-economic) can be decided upon finally and paired states can work to find solutions to these.

India is unique nation, whose fabric has been woven by diverse linguistic, cultural and religious threads, held together into a composite national identity by a rich history of cultural evolution, coupled with a rousing freedom struggle that was built around the tenets of non-violence and justice. The spirit of mutual understanding amidst a shared history has enabled a special unity in diversity, which stands out as a tall flame of nationhood that needs to be nourished and cherished into the future.

With a view to foster national integration by a co-ordinated mutual engagement process between States, Union Territories, Central Ministries, Educational Institutions and general public through linguistic, literary, cultural, sports, tourism and other forms of people-to-people exchanges, the Government of India has launched an initiative Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat (EBSB).

All the 36 States/ UTs in India have been paired for an entire year and mandated to sign MoUs with each other, delineating a set of activities that they would carry out together though the year. Such interaction between deferent segments of the population of each pair of States/ UTs at the cultural level, would generate the vibrancy of understanding & appreciation amongst the people and forge mutual bonding, thus securing an enriched value system of unity in the nation. Plan of action on Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat in Higher Educational institutions

It has been decided in the meeting in PMO that the Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat (EBSB) should be intensified and spread to the all the Higher Educational Institutions in the Country with special emphasis on the following institutions:

- A) All Central Universities (40) (Action: JS CU)
- B) All NITs (32) (Action: Addl DG)
- C) All IITs (23) (Action: AS TE)
- D) Other Central Institutions (5) (Action: JS A)
- E) All RUSA funded State Universities/Colleges (Action: RUSA unit)
- F) All AICTE regulated colleges (Action: Chairman AICTE)

Programme of action for EBSB :-

1. Student exchanges:

Every year, at least (50) students of a HEI in one State will travel and spend 10 days in the paired institution of the paired State. (The pairing of States would be intimated in due course). The purpose would be to learn the language, culture, living styles, festivals, social customs, food habits and such other aspects of the social and cultural affairs of the paired State. The contingent would be led by one or more teachers who will be responsible for the proper organisation of the visit and also for the safety of the students.

The organisation of the student exchange would be done in the following manner:-

- a) Identification of the contingent: Students in each institution may be invited to participate in a competition, such as a quiz regarding paired State. Such students who have exhibited minimum knowledge and understanding of the paired State should be selected.
- b) Conduct of the visit:- The visit will be done in accordance with the dates agreed with the paired institution. Since Indian Railways is expected to give concession for the movement of students under EBSB, it is advised to use the Railways for movement of students to the extent possible. The visiting students would be housed in the hostels of the paired institution. Suitable facilities should be provided by the paired institution for this purpose. The contingent will not only interact with the local students, but would also fan out to visit historical sites, villages around the institution and would learn the language of the paired State. They would also learn the dance and customs of the paired State. Each



of the learning process should be properly documented through photos, videos, write-ups etc.

c) Preparing reports: Each member of the visiting contingents is expected to focus on one aspect of the culture of the State which has been visited; and prepare a small write-up along with photographs within 30 days from the date of return from the visit.

d) Dissemination: The report so prepared would be printed and should be shared using social media accounts like Facebook and Twitter, duly tagging the social media accounts of the Ministry, and EBSB. Apart from above, they will share the findings of the visit with the larger audience in the college.

The cost of the student visit should be locally managed by the institution.

2. Youth Festival:

One institution in every State with adequate infrastructure would be identified to conduct EBSB Youth Festival in which all the Universities (and their affiliated colleges) in their State, and all Universities and affiliated colleges in the paired State, should be invited to participate in various cultural and sports competitions. Similarly, wherever there is TECH festival in IITs etc. there could be special events with the paired State.

3. Exchange by teachers:

In every State, about (50) teachers would be selected (by the RUSA State Coordinator) for exchange visit to the paired State. Teachers so selected should have in-depth knowledge of the culture, music, dance and life style of their State. The teachers' visit would be organised by the paired State RUSA unit, and should facilitate talks and in various HEIs of the State covering as many institutions as possible.

4. Screening of films etc:-

All Higher Educational Institutions in each State should organise screening of the films of the paired State for which the institutions should make suitable arrangements.

5. EBSB Day in all Central Institutions:

In every Central Institution like IIT, NIT, CU, who are having students from various parts of the country, there shall be (10) EBSB days per year @ 1 day per every month depicting the culture of the paired State.



During these days, there shall be food, cultural demonstrations of the paired States along with screening of popular films in both the languages.

6. EBSB Clubs:

Every Higher Educational Institution should have a EBSB Club whose aim would be to propagate language, culture of the paired State through various activities (**Action: UGC**). The best EBSB Club would be awarded by Hon'ble Minister on 31st October, 2020.

7. Translation of popular books:

CIIL, Mysore may be asked to translate the popular books of the paired State into other Indian language. An action plan will be prepared by the CIIL for this purpose.

Action Plan by HEIs

In accordance with the above, every institution under MHRD control would need to prepare a date-wise action plan covering all the activities before **22nd October 2019**. This will be printed and released on 31st October 2019. A format in which these activities are to be listed is enclosed.

All HEIs should also identify a nodal officer for this activity for their institution.

EBSB Campaign Office

EBSB Campaign Office will be set up in MHRD with the help of 5 young professional to be recruited by Edcil with organisational skills and skills for launching media campaign, content writing and social media management. This Unit should start functioning from 1st week of November, 2019 and shall be responsible for coordination the above effort.

The Ministry of Human Resource Development has selected your institution for pairing with institution from pairing state (Name of institution, location, State available at link mentioned in the mail) under Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat (EBSB) Programme. Student Exchange

- b) **Conduct of the visit:-** The visit will be done in accordance with the dates agreed with the paired institution. Since Indian Railways is expected to give concession for the movement of students under EBSB, it is advised to use the Railways for the movement of the students to the extent possible. The visiting students would be housed in the hostels of the paired institution. Suitable facilities should be provided by the paired institution for this purpose. The contingent will not only interact with the local students, but would also fan out to visit historical sites, villages around the institution and would learn the language of the paired State. They would also learn the dance and customs of the paired State. Each of the learning process should be properly documented through photos, videos, write-ups, etc.


